Temple-Inland has an overall objective to increase the amount of recycled content in its Particleboard products and reclaiming materials from its production processes to further reduce the amount of wood entering the waste stream.

To help implement and achieve the above sustainability and recycling objectives, Temple-Inland has developed and adopted appropriate programs and documented procedures to ensure our wood fiber procurement and particleboard production, labeling and environmental claims are consistent with the FSC Chain of Custody and Controlled Wood Standards.

Temple-Inland shall annually review the effectiveness of its FSC Sustainability Commitment, chain of custody and controlled wood sourcing programs to continually improve management system performance.
